Behavior Workshop



Greater Michigan PMC is in its second year supporting the Behavior Workshop. The Behavior Workshop is a nonprofit youth development and community improvement

organization, working to introduce positive alternative lifestyles to the at-risk-populations throughout southeastern Michigan.

Behavior Workshop provides an Activity Center that features a library, play area, computer workstations and a game area. It keeps after school-hours during the school year and is open during the summer providing lunches along



with activities. Their mission is to assist families in removing barriers from their lives that will stunt their growth and development.

This year our involvement included sponsoring computer parts for their C.A.P.S. Program. C.A.P.S. is an 8 week after school computer-building workshop for disadvantaged youths aged 10 – 17 who reside in low income housing. The workshop teaches basic hardware and software concepts and successful assembly of the P.C. The long term objectives are to improve youth academic performance and school attendance, develop model students with possible careers in computer technology, decrease dropout rate by creating youth interest in computer building, and to decrease juvenile delinquency by implementing effective after-school programs for at-risk youth.

We were also sponsors of the 2006 Youth Retreat at Cedar Point. Pictured are children that were able to attend this retreat as participating members of the Center.

Friends in Deed

During their 90-day stay, residents work toward establishing greater selfsufficiency with the goal of being able to move into permanent housing and employment. With the aid of individual casework

services, residents address the causes at the root of their homelessness while enacting permanent, positive change in their lives.

A program for Washtenaw County homeless veterans was initiated under the umbrella of The Staples Center. The former Arbor Haven, now the Veterans



Haven of Hope House, has been converted into a transitional housing unit for up to seven male veterans. An additional four veterans (males, females and family members) will be housed in The Staples Family Center. It is only through the support of The Festive Affair and its generous contributors over the past 15 years that The Staples Family Center and its residents have been able to thrive.
