Tours of projects at WSU were arranged on new facilities on the campus.

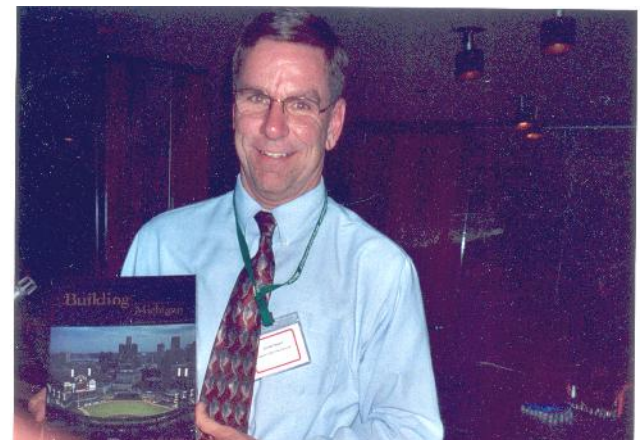
Topics covered throughout the two-day program addressed: master planning,
