The Opening remarks and encouraging words about the career opportunities available to well-educated and talented young people who are in-

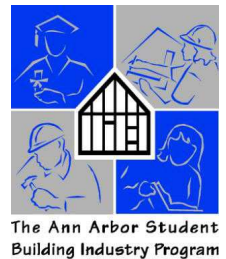


terested in gaining full-time employment or student internships with the mechanical contracting, mechanical service and plumbing industry.
