The Moving Wall is a half-size replica of the Washington, DC Vietnam Veteran's Memorial that tours the country.

THE NAMES OF THOSE WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES AND OF THOSE WHO REMAIN MISSING ARE INSCRIBED IN THE ORDER THEY WERE TAKEN FROM US.” The effort to host the Moving Wall is a collaborative one involving H.E.R.O., Veteran's Organizations from throughout the area, local businesses, organizations such as ours, and community volunteers.



The Moving Wall or (The Wall that Heals) came to Bennett Park in Livingston County on August 29- September 2, 2014 with the help of the Labor Management Fund. On Veterans Day 1996, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund unveiled a half-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. designed to travel to communities throughout the United States. Bringing the Wall home to communities' throughout our country allows the souls enshrined on the Memorial to exist once more among family and friends in the peace and comfort of familiar surroundings. It is approximately 250 feet in length, and like the original Memorial is erected in a chevron-shape, and the names are listed by day of casualty.
